

HSB4U~ Independent Study Project

Objective:

Using the social science inquiry process students will develop a position on a **social issue** relevant to the Challenge and Change course and design a plan to complete a research project, with a focus in one of the social science disciplines.

The ISP will be divided up into 4 phases as follows:

Phase I: Proposal			
☐ Students need to choose a topic of interest which guide their inquiry			
☐ Students must formulate 6-10 possible inquiry questions relating to their topic ☐ Students must clearly state their hypothesis			
 Keep in mind, in social science a hypothesis is a statement about the <u>relationship between variables</u> that you set out to investigate 			
<u>DUE</u> : <u>Friday, October 3, 2014</u>			
Phase II: Research Notes & Annotated Bibliography			
☐ Students will submit their rough notes , either typed or hand written			
☐ The notes should be divided into subheadings developed from some of your inquiry questions in Phase I			
☐ Finally, students must submit an Annotated Bibliography (minimum 6 Sources)			
DUE: Friday Nov 7, 2014			
Phase III: Primary Research			
☐ Students will be required to conduct primary research to test their hypothesis using			
one of the 3 methods discussed in class (survey/interview/observation)			
☐ Students must determine an appropriate sample size for their research			
☐ Students will analyze the results of their findings and communicate these results in			
their final report (this will be the Results section of your final paper)			
DUE: Monday, Dec 1, 2014			
Phase IV: Final Product			
☐ Students will complete and submit a formally written Social Science Research Paper			
☐ The paper will follow APA Guidelines for style, format and citations			
☐ This report should be typed and submitted in a folder			
☐ Your report will be between 8-10 pages (this includes your cover page, references and abstract)			
DUE: Friday, Dec 19, 2014			



Possible Report Topics:

These are only suggested areas of interest. They are not actual essay topics or theses. You need to choose some areas of interest and do some preliminary research to find out enough about the topic to develop a hypothesis. *Try to keep as narrow a focus as possible to increase the likelihood that your essay will have some depth.*
